Frank Fiorilli has been the centerpiece of the Lions' defensive unit this fall. A starter in 13 games on the 2007 campaign, he has a pair of goals, while helping to anchor a defense that has allowed only 18 goals this fall. He was named to the All-Tournament Team at Rowan's Harrison House Invitational. Overall on his career, he has now played in 63 games with three goals, two assists and eight points. As a freshman, in 2004, he started 13 of the 14 games he played, but was sidelined with a head injury that kept him out of the lineup for four games. While on the field, he helped solidify a defense that allowed 1.32 goals per game in 2004 and only 1.04 goals per game in 2005, while helping the 2005 team post six shutouts.



As a sophomore, he started all 20 games in the Lions' backfield. His positioning on the defensive side of the ball is extremely good. As a junior, he earned the team's Defensive Player of the Year honor after a stellar campaign. His skills and style of play were instrumental in the accomplishments of the team in both 2005 and 2006 as he helped anchor a young backfield.

He possesses a tremendous ability to position himself on the defensive side of the ball and has the ability to anticipate plays and eliminate opportunities before they become dangerous. He was a 15-game starter last fall having played in all 16 games with a goal and a pair of assists. He was tapped for the 2006 NJAC Honorable Mention Team in the backfield. His leadership both on and off the field will be vital in establishing the good mentality that is needed for a successful campaign.

He is majoring in interdisciplinary general business at TCNJ and now has a 3.261 GPA. He earned a spot on the 2005-2006 NJAC All-Academic Honorable Mention Team and is also a TCNJ Scholar-Athlete honoree. He is a candidate for the ESPN The Magazine CoSIDA Academic All-America Team this year.

#1 Matt Kasperavicius Goalie Jackson/Jackson, NJ

Matt Kasperavicius enjoyed an amazing rookie campaign in net for the Lions as his 2005 season concluded with a selection to the NSCAA All-American Third Team. His All-America selection comes on the heels of a selection as the 2005 NJAC Goalie of the Year after also earning a spot on the 2005 NJAC All-Star First Team. Voted the team's most improved player for the 2005 season, he earned three selections as the NJAC's Goalie of the Week and a pair of selections as the ECAC's Defensive Player of the Week.

A 2005-2006 NJAC Scholar-Athlete Second Team Honoree, Kasperavicius started all 20 games in net and finished the season with a 0.93 goals against average with only 18 goals allowed in 1750 minutes of work. He helped anchor a defense that combined for six shutouts in 2005 and returned last fall to once again guard the net as a 16-game starter. On the 2006 season, he finished with a 1.36 goals against average with a pair of shutouts. On his career, he is now 23-11-2 in net for the Lions with a 1.12 career goals against average with eight shutouts to his credit.

On the 2007 season, he started 5 games and put together a 4-1 record in goal with a 1.75 GAA in 360 minutes of work. He was named the MVP of the 2007 Rowan University Harrison House Invitational. He now has a 27-12-2 record in goal with 8 career shutouts and a 1.18 career GAA in 41 games played.

A TCNJ Scholar-Athlete, he has a 3.21 GPA as a finance major at TCNJ and is a candidate for the ESPN The Magazine CoSIDA Academic All-America Team this year after excelling in the classroom and earning another selection as a TCNJ Scholar-Athlete in 2006-07.

Craig Langan is serving as one of the Lions' tri-captain this fall after excelling last season. His junior campaign wrapped with a selection to the 2006 NJAC Honorable Mention Team in the midfield after he added a pair of goals and assists for the Lions. He enters the 2007 season having earned the Team's Most Improved Player last fall as the ultimate team player for his selfless contributions to the team. He will look to help the team get back to the success enjoyed during his sophomore season when the Lions captured both the 2005 NJAC regular-season and tournament championships.

During the 2005 season, he was a 20-game starter with 15 points. He helped the team advance to the NCAA quarterfinals after adding four goals and seven assists with a game-winning goal in the NJAC semifinals as TCNJ bested NJCU, 3-2.

Thus far on the 2007 season, he has started all 14 games and is the team's second leading scorer with 14 points on 6 goals and 2 assists. He has 2 game winning goals and has now started 63 of 68 games played with 41 points on 15 goals and 11 assists.

He is a finance major at TCNJ and is a former two sport athlete at Kings Park High, where he excelled in both soccer and basketball, earning six letters and serving as team captain for the soccer team as a senior. He guided his soccer team to the semifinals of the county championships and was a Siemen's Westinghouse Finalist after also earning a selection to the honor roll and serving as Student Council Vice President.

As a rookie, Joe McGinley played in all 18 games and made 16 starts. He quickly became the leader of the Lions' central midfield. Possessing great ball skills and the ability to read the game, McGinley is a constant threat to opposing teams. His ability to switch the point of attack and spot open teammates up the field are what qualified him as part of the 2004 NJAC All-Conference honorable mention team in 2004.

As a sophomore, McGinley started 18 games for the Lions and led the squad with seven assists. He earned a spot on the 2005 NSCAA All-Region First team and the 2005 NJAC All-Star First Team after netting 11 points on the season. An NJAC and ECAC Player of the Week honoree in 2005, he earned his selections following the Lions' posting the game winner in the Lions' 1-0 win over Rowan on September 28 and a second goal on a penalty kick in the match-up with Rutgers-Camden, while assisting on the game winner in the contest for TCNJ in the Lions' 2-1 win on Oct. 1.

In his third campaign, McGinley was once again recognized for his success on the pitch as he was tapped for the 2006 NJAC Second Team All-Star Team in the midfield. He appeared in 15 games with 14 starts as a junior and added four points on a goal and two assists.

He is serving as a team tri-captain this season. He has started 11 of 12 games played in now has 4 points on a goal and 2 assists. Overall on his career, he has now with him, having now started 49 of 63 games played with 5 goals, 12 assists, and 22 points to his credit.

His younger sister, Brittany, plays for the Player Development Academy (PDA), and is a newcomer on TCNJ's women's soccer team this fall. He is a open option business major at TCNJ and a TCNJ Scholar-Athlete with a 3.349 gpa.

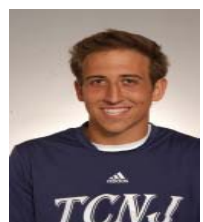


#11 Nima Rahimi Forward Wharton, NJ/Morris Hills

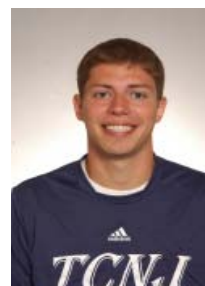


#0 Stephen Scutellaro Goalkeeper Brick, NJ/Brick Memorial
