

2008 TCNJ WOMEN'S SENIOR DAY!

TCNJ's athletic department would like to recognize its seniors and congratulate them on their outstanding careers. Over their time with the Lions, these outstanding student-athletes have distinguished themselves both in the court and in the classroom. Over the past four years, this outstanding group of student-athletes have helped the Lions garner numerous honors and have combined to produce a 52-13 record in dual meet competition, while this season also racking up a No. 26 national ranking with seven 9-0 wins over opponents. During this same time frame, these players have also helped the Lions dominate the NJAC in women's tennis, while also helping the team earn NCAA Championship appearances as well. The squad has racked up a combined 21-0 conference mark during their careers, extending the College's NJAC win streak to 121 wins and 25 consecutive NJAC Championship titles.

Kimberly Lee Lum

A four-year letterwinner for the Lions, Kimberly Lee Lum has helped the women's tennis team on and off the courts. She has seen limited time in the lineup, but has added a 3-4 record in singles competition with a 9-12 effort in doubles play over the past four seasons.



Off the court, she has contributed as well for the Lions and the College. An elementary education major with a concentration in Math, Science and Technology, Lee Lum is a former scholastic star at nearby West Windsor-Plainsboro South. A two-time team captain, she earned Most Improved Player honors as a freshman and was named team MVP as a senior. She helped her team to the state finals and the county championship during her career.

Ariel Donohue

A four-time honoree as a TCNJ Scholar-Athlete, Ariel Donohue is also a four-year letterwinner for the Lions. Over the course of her Lion career, she has racked up a 13-6 record in singles action, including a 6-3 record last year. In limited doubles competition, she has added a 5-1 record as well for the Lions.

Active on campus, Ariel has been involved with TCNJ's Women in Learning and Leadership (WILL) program and is a former president of the group. An elementary education and women and gender studies major at TCNJ, she is a former two-time MVP of the tennis program at Cornwall High, where she also served as a team captain and qualified for the sectionals three times during her career.



Christina Contrafatto

Captain

Christina Contrafatto came to TCNJ after a distinguished scholastic career, where she recorded a 25-0 singles record as a senior, while playing on the No. 1 ranked team in the state, Cherry Hill East High School. A four-time All-South Jersey honoree, she achieved a No. 17 ranking in the Middle States in singles and a No. 3 ranking in doubles during her senior year.

As a TCNJ rookie, she earned the No. 1 spot in the lineup in both singles and doubles and combined for a 29-16 record in her collegiate debut. Tapped as the 2004 NJAC Player and Rookie of the Year, Contraffatto went 15-8 on the year in singles play and 13-8 with Jackie Gavornik in doubles competition. In addition, she reached the quarterfinals of the 2004 ITA Northeast Regional Singles Championship in her first month as a Lion.

Contraffatto continued her dominance as a sophomore, once again playing first singles. She was the 2005 ITA Northeast Regional Champion, and traveled to the ITA Nationals, where she took seventh nationally to earn ITA All-America honors. On the season, Contraffatto amassed a 20-6 record in singles and 12-2 in doubles.



As a junior, she had another stellar season having once again earned ITA All-America honors in the fall after teaming with Jackie Shtemberg to take fifth place nationally after capturing the 2006 ITA Northeast Regional Doubles Championship. Overall on the season, she went 11-3 in singles play with an impressive 8-3 mark at the No. 2 spot, while adding a 24-6 doubles record to her resume. In doubles as a junior, Contraffatto amassed an 11-3 tournament record with a 13-3 dual meet record.

A two-time NJAC Player of the Year honoree, she was named to the league's All-Star Team in doubles in 2006 after leading the Lions to another conference championship crown. As a junior, she earned a No. 23 national ranking in doubles in 2006-2007, while boasting a No. 24 regional singles ranking and a No. 7 regional doubles ranking.

Adding All-NJAC conference honors again in the fall of 2007, Contraffatto is a four-time All-NJAC performer in both singles and doubles play as a Lion. She has a 16-9 record in singles play this season and is ranked 19th in the latest ITA regional singles poll and with her partner, Shtemberg holds a No. 3 regional ranking in doubles as well. Overall on the 2007-2008 season, she has racked up some impressive singles wins, while adding a 21-9 effort in doubles play.

Entering today's match she boasts an outstanding career record that included three ITA All-America citations as well as a record of 62-26 in singles play with a 76-27 record in doubles competition. Overall, she has a combined career record that is 138-53 for a .722 career win percentage as a Lions.
